Parents who want a Catholic Faith Formation & Education for their children will see to it that their family attends Mass faithfully EVERY Sunday.
- An active parishioner gives of themselves by donating TIME, TALENT and TREASURE to the ministries of the parish and or to the volunteer organizations that support the parish. We are to share in the responsibilities that keep our Parish alive in a vibrant way.
- An active parishioner is a good financial steward of the church. As a parishioner, it is important to understand that giving financially to support the parish is a vital and key component to active parishioner status.


An active member:

Vesting Prayers

Did you know that as a priest dresses for Mass, or vests, he may pray special prayers to help him prepare? While putting on his alb, or inner white garment, he prays, "Cleanse me, O Lord, and purify my heart, that washed in the Blood of the Lamb, I may attain everlasting joy." When putting on the cincture, or belt, he says, "Gird me, O Lord, with the cincture of purity and quench in me the fire of concupiscence; that the virtue of continence and chastity may remain in me." As he dons his stole, his prayer is, "Return to me, O Lord, the stole of immortality, which I have lost in the sin of my first parent; and although I, unworthy, approach Thy sacred Mystery, grant to me, nevertheless, everlasting joy." And finally, when putting on his chasuble, he prays, "O Lord, Who has said, My voke is easy and My burden light; grant that I may be able so to bear it, that I may obtain Thy grace. Amen." Since our priests pray before dressing for Mass, wouldn't it be appropriate if we did the same?

Sponsorship for the Sacrament of Baptism and Confirmation

Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, and Confirmation and if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years old.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church. In other words, be an Active member of the parish. (See page one of the bulletin for a description of and Active member.)
- If he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. William the Abbot years ago but now lives elsewhere, he/she is not an active member of this parish. Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in whose territory he/she resides. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.


Profession of Faith—The Creed

Let us stand now and profess our faith—I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. Sound familiar? If you're a Catholic, you could probably recite the rest of that from memory, couldn't you? But what are those words we say at every Mass? It's called the Nicene Creed, and it is a synopsis of the things that we, as Christians believe.

The original Nicene Creed was issued in 325 A.D. It was written to clear up a number of heresies going around at that time, particularly Arianism, which denied the divinity of Christ. But that's not the same thing we say a Mass on Sunday. The Nicene Creed we still recite today came from the Council of Constantinople in 381. The council fathers there added to the Nicene Creed more about the person of Christ, the Holy Spirit, the Church, baptism, the resurrection and eternal life.

So, if you're ever asked what you believe as a Christian, you can give a complete answer in about sixty seconds . . .with the Nicene Creed.
