- An active parishioner is a person who has received or is preparing to receive the sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation.
- An active parishioner is a person who attends Mass regularly at St. William the Abbot and actively supports the sacramental programs for Penance, Eucharist and Confirmation. Parents who want a Catholic Faith Formation & Education for their children will see to it that their family attends Mass faithfully EVERY Sunday.
- An active parishioner gives of themselves by donating TIME, TALENT and TREASURE to the ministries of the parish and or to the volunteer organizations that support the parish. We are to share in the responsibilities that keep our Parish alive in a vibrant way.
- An active parishioner is a good financial steward of the church. As a parishioner, it is important to understand that giving financially to support the parish is a vital and key component to active parishioner status.

# Why you need to be an active parishioner

Parishioners seeking to be godparents or sponsors for the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation, or those wishing to be joined in Holy Matrimony must first be verified as "active members" of the parish.

- 4) Consistently uses the parish envelope system or the electronic giving program to support the parish.

# An Update on Parish building & grounds improvements

Dear friends,

You may have recently noticed, the removal of most of the shrubs and bushes that hugged the perimeter of our building.

A brief explanation: It should be no surprise to anyone that Houses of Worship have been a recent target for Homegrown Violent Extremists (HVE). While St. William the Abbot Parish has never been a target, we want to do all we can to ensure the safety of our parishioners, especially our children in our SOR, and in Precious Angels.

Early this year we had a security assessment completed by the NJ Office of Homeland Security. The completed "Site Assessment Report" highlighted several areas that would improve our overall level of security. Among the areas for improvement were "overgrowth of trees and shrubs around the perimeter of the building... allows for hiding of persons or dangerous objects...." Hence, the decision to remove any shrubs or plants that allow for concealment. Our plan also includes replanting of small shrubs and groundcover in the Spring. Thanks to the generosity of our parish members, we will continue to make repairs and improvements as necessary.

### **Experience the Eucharistic Miracles Exhibit**

This traveling exhibit has been created to assist those who will experience it to affirm belief in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. It is based upon the website created by Blessed Carlo Acutis to catalogue all the eucharistic miracles that have taken place worldwide.

The exhibit is circular and is divided into seven sections or rooms. In the first six rooms, information about the Eucharistic miracles is displayed. Each panel names a miracle, recounts the story of its occurrence and the country where it took place. The panels are arranged in chronological order from the early Third Century to 2013. Be sure to notice the date on the timeline and some of the world events that will help you to place in within the historical era.

All of the rooms point to the center of the exhibit. This is to intentionally remind us that the historical miracles we are learning about on the walls of the exhibit are all pointing to the miracle in front of us—Jesus, present the Most Holy Eucharist! In the seventh room, the Eucharist is clearly visible in the monstrance and a place has been prepared for you to rest a while in His presence.

Now until September 9th, the exhibit is at Holy Family Community Center in Lakewood. The exhibit is open to the public. The hours are Monday thru Friday, 12PM until 8PM. Saturday and Sunday before and after all weekend Masses.

# Sponsorship for the Sacrament of Baptism and Confirmation

# **Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate**

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, and Confirmation and if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years old.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church. In other words, be an Active member of the parish.
- If he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. William the Abbot years ago but now lives elsewhere, he/she is not an active member of this parish. Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in whose territory he/she resides. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.


