# Marking the days of Ordinary Time with the Saints

Sunday September 19 St. Januarius	<b>First Reading:</b> <i>Wisdom 2:12,17-20</i> The just one is put to the test. <b>Second Reading:</b> <i>James 3:16-4:3</i> James teaches about the wisdom from above. <b>Gospel Reading:</b> <i>Mark 9:30-37</i> Jesus teaches his disciples that the greatest are those who serve all.  Saint Januarius was bishop of Benevento. Along with his companions he was martyred at Naples in the persecution of Diocletian. Today he is especially venerated in the city of Naples.
Monday September 20 Sts. Andrew Kim Tae-gon, Paul Chong Ha-sang, and Companions	Andrew was born in Seoul, Korea and converted to the faith. He was ordained Korea's first native priest. His father was a martyr. In 1846, Andrew was tortured and beheaded along with his lay associate, seminarian Paul Chong Ha-sang. Between 1839 and 1867, 103 martyrs gave their lives for the faith in Korea.
Tuesday September 21 St. Matthew	According to the bishop, Papias, the Church's canonical text of Matthew draws upon the Aramaic traditions associated with his name. Composed in the 85th century, the gospel is generally arranged in an alternating pattern of narrative and discourse. Intended for a largely Jewish-Christian audience, it seeks to portray Christianity as consistent with the Jewish tradition and a continuation of it. Tradition holds that Matthew preached in Judea and in Ethiopia where he was martyred.
Wednesday September 22	Take a minute out of your day today to stop and thank God for all your blessings. When we are grateful, even for a minute, the Holy Spirit dwells in our minds and hearts and we are opened to the ways of His love. When we are grateful, we understand all the more who God really is, and thus, who we are as well. Take a minute each day and use that time to thank GodJon Leonetti
Thursday September 23 St. Pius of Pietrelcina	"Padre Pio" was born Francesco Forgione in 1887, in the small Italian village of Pietrelcina. A Capuchin priest who had received the stigmata, he spent fifty years in the monastery of San Giovanni Rotondo, where he was much sought after as a spiritual advisor, confessor, and intercessor. Despite such notoriety, he would often say, "I only want to be a poor friar who prays." His life was devoted to the Eucharist and to prayer. He died on September 23, 1968, at the age of eightyone. St. Pope John Paul II, announced the inclusion of his Memorial in the General Roman calendar in June, 2002. He is considered the patron of civil defense volunteers and Catholic adolescents.
Friday September 24 St. Rupert	St. Rupert of Salzburg was bishop of Worms when Childeric III asked that he evangelize Bavaria. Rupert travelled from Ratisbon to the Danube, where he converted Duke Theod II. The duke gave him land at lavavum, on which Rupert established the abbey of St. Peter and the Nonnberg convent. Its abbess was his niece, Erendruda. Rupert also converted pagan temples into Christian churches and established the salt-mining industry from which the city takes its present name, Salzburg. Rubert reportedly died on Easter Sunday around 710 and was buried in St. Peter's abbey. Vergil of Salzberg later translated his relics to the cathedral in Salzberg.

40 Days for Life

The 40 Days for Life event is coming up again from September 22 to October 31. 40 Days for Life is a campaign of prayer and fasting for an end to abortion here in America. Since its inception in 2007, it has proven to be very effective: 19,198 babies have been saved, 221 abortion workers have quit, and 112 abortion centers have closed.

40 Days for Life also involves prayerful, peaceful witnessing in front of an abortion clinic (Planned Parenthood facility at 69 E. Newman Springs Road in Shrewsbury). We have been asked to staff each Wednesday from September 22 to October 31. That would be 6 Wednesdays, from 8AM to 6PM.
