
- An active parishioner is a person who has received or is preparing to receive the sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation.

Marking the days of the Ordinary Time with the Saints

Sunday, January 29 Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time	First Reading: Zephaniah 2:3,3:12-13 There will be a people who remain sheltered from God's anger. Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 1:25-31 God chooses the weak to show his power. Gospel: Matthew 5:1-12a Jesus teaches what it means to be happy.
Monday, January 30 St. Aldegunais	St. Aldegunais was a virgin and abbess and was born in the year 639. She was a member of the royal family of the Merovingians and was raised by two saints: St. Walbert and St. Bertila, her parents. The family resided in the Hainault region of Flanders, a region of the Low Countries. Aldegundis reflused offers of marriage from other nobles and received the veil from St. Amandius, the bishop of Maastricht. She followed this ceremony of acceptance into the religious life with the foundation of a convent near the Sambre River, at a desert site called Malbode. Her sister, St. Waldetrudis, had founded a convent at Mons. Aldegundis' foundation became Mauberge, a noted Benedictine monastery, later taken over by canonesses. Aldegundis is reported to have died of cancer at the age of forty-four in the year 684.
Tuesday, January 31 St. Francis Zavier Bianchi	Saint Francis Xavier Bianchi, of Arpino, Italy, born in the year 1743, suffered much in striving to overcome his father's opposition to his religious vocation. Having been ordained a Barnabite priest at the age of twenty-four, Father Bianchi spent hour upon hour in the confessional, sustained by a deep prayer life. His personal resolve to make himself always and everywhere available to anyone seeking his priestly ministry and counsel seemed to impart to his words and prayers an extraordinary efficacy. Later in life, Father Bianchi was crippled by the swelling and ulceration of both his legs, rendering him incapable of moving about or even standing on his own. He nonetheless managed to continue celebrating Mass. When in 1805 a lava flow from the erupting Mount Vesuvius threatened Naples, he had himself carried to the advancing edge of the lava, where with a blessing he halted it. Although bedridden, Father Bianchi continued to counsel those who came to him. Three days before his death in the year 1815, he experienced a vision of his deceased penitent, Saint Mary Frances of Naples, who before her own death in 1791 had promised to appear to him thus.
Wednesday, February 1 St. Pionius	Saint Pionius was a martyr with Sabinus and Asclepiades. A priest from Smyma, Pionius was put to death with a group of fifteen companions under Emperor Traj anus Decius. They were arrested during a liturgical celebration. Known for his wisdom and abilities as a preacher, Pionius and his companions were ordered to make sacrifices to the gods and, after they refused, they were put to terrible tortures before being burned at the stake, in the year 250.
Thursday, February 2 St. Joan de Lestonnac	Saint Joan de Lestonnac was born in Bordeaux, France, in 1556. She married at the age of seventeen. The happy marriage produced four children, but her husband died suddenly in 1597. After her children were raised, she entered the Cistercian monastery at Toulouse. Joan was forced to leave the Cistercians when she became afflicted with poor health. She returned to Bordeaux with the idea of forming a new congregation, and several young girls joined her as novices. They ministered to victims of a plague that struck Bordeaux, and they were determined to counteract the evils of heresy promulgated by Calvinism. Thus was formed the Congregation of the Religious of Notre Dame of Bordeaux. In 1608, Joan and her companions received the religious habit from the Archbishop of Bordeaux. Joan was elected superior in 1610, and many miracles occurred at her tomb. She was canonized in 1949 by Pope Pius XII.
Friday, February 3 St. Margaret of England	Saint Margaret of England was a Cistercian nun. She was born in Hungary, to an English mother who was related to St. Thomas of Canterbury, England. She went with her mother on a pilgrimage to Jerusalem and lived a life of austerity and penance in Bethlehem. Her mother died there, and Margaret made pilgrimages to Montserrat, in Spain, and to Puy, France. There she entered the Cistercian convent at Suave-Benite. When she died, her tomb became a pilgrimage shrine. She died in the year 1192.



Respect Life News

WASHINGTON—The following are excerpts of remarks by Rep. Chris Smith (R-NJ), Co-Chair of the Congressional Pro-Life Caucus, during last week's debate on the House Floor on H.Con.Res. 3—legislation condemning the recent attacks on pro-life organizations and churches:

"Two women spoke at a pregnancy care center dinner I attended in New Jersey. Both women were effusive in their thanks that the director had approached them in absolute kindness and empathy as they were literally walking from the parking lot to an abortion clinic. They changed their minds and were helped through their pregnancy and after the birth of their children. Later in the program, two young teenaged girls spoke of the sanctity of life and the good work of the pregnancy center. From the podium, they turned to the director and thanked her and said had she not reached out to their moms that day and followed up with such love and compassion, both of them said they would have been killed.

Pregnancy care centers across the country have suffered a surge of violent attacks, firebombing and vandalism by pro-abortion activists in a coordinated effort to intimidate front-line volunteers and licensed medical professionals providing critical support to mothers in need and their unborn baby boys and girls. Now more than ever, the U.S. government—and that includes the Biden Administration—needs to ensure the safety and security of the estimated 3,000 pregnancy care centers that provide life-affirming alternatives to abortion—offering critical, quality care for pregnant women facing challenging circumstances and helping to save so many unborn, innocent lives.

The lives of more than 828,130 unborn babies have been saved in five years alone (2016-2020) through the work of pregnancy care centers."
