- An active parishioner is a person who attends Mass regularly at St. William the Abbot and actively supports the sacramental programs for Penance, Eucharist and Confirmation. Parents who want a Catholic Faith Formation & Education for their children will see to it that their family attends Mass faithfully EVERY Sunday.
- An active parishioner gives of themselves by donating TIME, TALENT and TREASURE to the ministries of the parish and or to the volunteer organizations that support the parish. We are to share in the responsibilities I that keep our Parish alive in a vibrant way.





Do I HAVE to go to Mass every Sunday? Here are the reasons why the answer to that question is YES.

1. God tells us to. At first, this may not seem very inspiring. God commands it: "Remember to keep holy the Sabbath day." When you go to Mass on Sunday, you receive tons of graces to help you tackle daily stress, conquer your vices, and grow closer to God. Those graces come from the Eucharist. When it comes to things Jesus told us to do, we like to remember the ones like "Love your enemies" and "Judge not, lest ye be judged." But he also said, "Do this in remembrance of me." That was at the Last Supper, when he took bread and wine and offered up the first Eucharist. The Catholic Church calls the Eucharist "the source and summit of the Christian life." When we receive the Eucharist, we receive Jesus Himself. What an incredible gift! When we go to Mass every Sunday, we are strengthened and nourished there like we can't be anywhere else.

2. We were made for it.

You were created by God to know Him and love Him. But you were not created to know and love God all be yourself. By the fact that you are human, you are made for community. We all naturally desire to have some kind of connection with other. That's how God created us. And by the fact that you're baptized, you are a member of the body of Christ. We all belong to Christ together. Therefore, we are not only meant to pray to God individually, we are meant to do it together. That's what we do every Sunday at Mass. The members of the Body of Christ are baptized to come together every Sunday to worship God together. We listen to the word of God together. We receive the Eucharist together. Just doing that for one hour makes a HUGH difference in your life. When we go to Mass every Sunday, we are living like the Body of Christ.

3. The Mass gets you ready for Heaven.

It would be odd if you showed up at someone's house and expected them to let you live there—especially if you weren't ready to live with them, or didn't even know them very well. Likewise, it would be odd, and sad, if you showed up at Heaven's gate expecting to go in, but you weren't really prepared to live there. St. John Henry Newman once said going to church prepares us for the "future glorious and most wonderful destiny, the sight of God, a destiny which, if not most glorious, will be most terrible." His point: meeting God face-to-face someday will not be easy. Going to church prepares you to meet God with joy and not with terror. You might say it makes you "fit for Heaven." All the things you do at Mass: the standing, the kneeling, the responses—and yes, even the singing—are like spiritual exercises that make your soul fit for a glorious life in Heaven. When we go to Mass every Sunday, we participate in the life of Heaven. So next time you hear, "Do we have to go to Mass every Sunday?", think of it not so much as an obligation but as the most incredible gift.
