




Palm Sunday

Marking the days of Lent

Sunday, April 10 Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord	First Reading: <i>Isaiah 50:4-7</i> The Lord's Servant will stand firm, even when persecuted. Second Reading: <i>Philippians 2:6-11</i> Christ was obedient even to death, but God has exalted him. Gospel: <i>Luke 22:14-23:56</i> From the cross, Jesus speaks words of forgiveness and promises that the good thief will be with him in paradise.
Monday, April 11 St. Stanislaus	Saint Stanislaus was born in the town of Szczepanow in Poland around the year 1030. He studied in Paris and was ordained to the priesthood. In 1071 he succeeded Bishop Lambert at Cracow. In this post he ruled as a good shepherd by helping the poor and visiting his clerics every year. He courageously rebuked King Boleslaus who put him to death in 1097.
Tuesday, April 12	Pray an extra Rosary today and every day this week.
Wednesday, April 13 St. Martin I	Saint Martin was born at Todi in Umbria, Italy. He became a member of the clery of Rome and was elected pope in 649. He convened the council which condemned the heresy of the Monothelites. In 653 he was taken prisoner by the Emperor Constans and detained in Constantinople where he was forced to suffer many indignities. Finally, having been exiled to Kherson, he died in 656.
Thursday, April 14 Holy Thursday	Try to find the time to read an entire Gospel at one sitting. Come to Holy Thursday Mass at 7:00PM and stay to pray at the Altar of Repose.
Friday, April 15 Good Friday	Passion of the Lord, 3:00PM Come to stations of the cross tonight at 7PM. If you cannot come, then meditate on the Stations of the Cross at home. Try to imagine yourself at the scene of each one.
Saturday, April 16 Holy Saturday	The Easter Vigil begins at sundown. Approx. 7:30PM


What is the Easter Triduum?

The Easter Triduum begins with evening Mass on Holy Thursday. It is referred to as *The Mass of the Lord's Supper*. This is where the Church remembers the institution of the Eucharist and the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass at the Last Supper, as well as the institution of the priesthood, which took place the evening before Jesus was crucified.

After the homily there is an optional washing of the feet ceremony, where the priest washes the feet of others to signify his role as servant, just as Jesus did with his disciples. Extra hosts are conse-

crated at this Mass to be used on Good Friday when no Mass will be celebrated.

The Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday concludes with a procession of the Blessed Sacrament to the "altar of repose," a place where the consecrated host is kept other than the main altar where Mass is normally celebrated. Because of the Last Supper, Holy Thursday is a day especially given to adoration of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist; many parishes will have Eucharistic Adoration at this altar of repose late into the night.



Good Friday

Good Friday is a mandatory day of fasting and abstinence. This is the day of the crucifixion, the day Jesus died for the sins of the world. The parish altar looks very different on Good Friday, it is plain and bare. There is no consecrated Host in the Tabernacle at the main altar of the church; it was carried away on Holy Thursday night to the "altar of repose" to signify Jesus' death. The candle by the Tabernacle is blown out, and the Tabernacle doors are left open to show that it is empty. Jesus is gone. This is quite dramatic, highlighting that God Friday is a solemn day of prayer and mourning.

The ceremony on Good Friday is not a Mass, but rather a communion service using the consecrated hosts from Holy Thursday. It often takes place at 3PM, the hour that Jesus breathed his last on the cross. Veneration of the Cross also takes place at this service, processing to kneel before a cross and either touching it or kissing it. Often the priest will begin the service prostrate in front of the altar.



Holy Saturday

On this day Christ is in the tomb. There is no daytime Mass on Holy Saturday. It is still a day of fasting and sorrow, the final one before the Easter Vigil begins that evening. We remember, with Mary and the disciples, that Jesus died and was separated from them for the first time as he lay in the tomb. The faithful often continue their Good Friday fast through Holy Saturday.

In the Apostles Creed we pray "He descended into hell" (Hades, the abode of the dead) which describes what Jesus did in the time between his burial and Resurrection. Jesus descended to the realm of the dead on Holy Saturday to save the righteous souls, such as the Old Testament patriarchs, who died before his crucifixion. The Catechism of the Catholic Church calls Jesus' descent into the realm of the dead "the last phase of Jesus' messianic mission," during which he "opened heaven's gates for the just who had gone before him." Before

Holy Saturday, there were no souls enjoying the beatific vision of God in heaven!

Easter Vigil/Easter Sunday

A vigil service is held after nightfall on Holy Saturday, or before dawn on Easter Sunday, in celebration of the resurrection of Jesus. This is called the Easter Vigil, the most glorious, beautiful, and dramatic liturgy in the Catholic Church.

The vigil is divided into four parts and can last up to three hours: 1) the service of light, 2) the liturgy of the Word, 3) the liturgy of Baptism, and 4) the liturgy of the Eucharist. This is also the Mass where many in RCIA are brought into full communion with the Catholic Church.

Easter Sunday is what we've all been waiting for! The 40 days of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving during Lent was in preparation for this day, when our heats and souls can drink in deeply the culmination of the Pascal mystery: the Resurrection.


"Therefore Easter is not simply one feast among others, but the 'Feast of feasts', the 'Solemnity of solemnities,' just as the Eucharist is the 'Sacrament of sacrament.' St. Athanasius calls Easter 'the Great Sunday' and the Eastern Churches call Holy Week 'the Great Week.' The mystery of the Resurrection, in which Christ crushed death, permeates with its powerful energy our old time, until all is subjected to him."




