Why is it so important to register with a parish?

Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Some people think that because they attend a particular parish they automatically belong. Registering as parishioners requires signing up, formally enrolling yourself in a parish. Registration is a commitment to a community, a way to be included in the religious, social and ministerial activities of your parish. Registration shows you belong. It is also necessary for certain benefits, like scheduling sacraments, obtaining a sponsor certificate, and getting donation statements for your taxes. Most importantly, it lets the parish count on you, to call on you to assist in its mission. Registering in your parish is a statement of faith and confidence in the life and work of your parish.

Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate/Letter of Eligibility

The godparents, together with the parents, must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it. (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874)

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, Confirmation, and if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years old.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.
- A sponsor must be registered here at St. William. If he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. William, but does not live here, they are not a member of this parish but a member of the parish whose territory he/she now resides in. That parish is the one to go to, to receive a sponsor certificate.

Marking the days of Ordinary Time with the Saints

Sunday, November 6 The Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time	First Reading: <i>2 Maccabees 7:1-2,9-14</i> Jewish martyrs give witness to their faith, even unto death. Second Reading: <i>2 Thessalonians 2:16-3:5</i> Paul encourages the Thessalonians and asks for their prayers. Gospel: <i>Luke 20:27-38</i> Jesus answers a question from some Sadducees about the resurrection of the dead.
Monday, November 7 St. Achillas	Saint Achillas was a Bishop and theologian who lived in an era of dispute in the Church. Achillas was the bishop of Alexandria, Egypt, one of the most powerful cities in the world at the time. Succeeding as bishop a man named St. Peter the Martyr, Achillas ordained Arius, who was to begin the influential heresy of Arianism. When Achillas recognized the untruths in Arius' preaching, he took steps to defend the faith and was attacked by Arius and another heretical group called the Meletians. Achillas remained firm in the faith. A council held in Alexandria condemned Arius and forced him to flee to Palestine. Achillas, however, did not live to see this condemnation. He died in the year 313.
Tuesday, November 8 Sts. Martin Tinh & Martin Tho	Saints Martin Tinh & Martin Tho were martyrs of Vietnam. Martin Tinh was an eighty-year-old Vietnamese priest at the time of his death. His companion, Martin Tho, was a tax collector. They were canonized in 1988 by Pope John Paul II.
Wednesday, November 9 The Dedication of the Lateran Basilica	Today marks the anniversary of the dedication of the cathedral church of Rome, on land owned by the Laterani family, be Pope St. Sylvester I. Honored as the episcopal seat of the pope as bishop of Rome. According to an inscription which Pope Clement XII placed on the façade, this basilica is the "mother and head of all churches of Rome and the world." Pope Innocent X commissioned the present structure in 1646. Beneath its high altar rests the remains of the small wooden table on which, according to tradition, St. Peter celebrated Mass. It was dedicated to the Savior, later to St. John the Baptist.
Thursday, November 10 St. Leo the Great	Saint Leo was probably born in Rome and was raised to the See of Peter in 440. He was a true pastor and father of souls. He labored strenuously to safeguard the integrity of the faith and vigorously defended the unity of the Church. He pushed back or at least softened the onrush of the barbarians. He has then deservedly won the title "the Great." He died in 461.
Friday, November 11 St. Martin of Tours	Saint Martin of Tours was born in Pannonia of pagan parents around the year 316. He gave up military life and was baptized. Soon after, he founded a monastery at Liguge in France where he led a monastic life under the direction of Saint Hilary. He was ordained a priest and chosen bishop of Tours. He provided an example of the ideal good pastor, founding other monasteries, educating the clergy, and preaching the Gospel to the poor. He died in 397.
Saturday, November 12 St. Josaphat	Saint Josephat was born in the Ukraine of Orthodox parents about the year 1580. Embracing the Catholic faith, he became a Basilian monk. Ordained to the priesthood and chosen bishop of Polock, he worked faithfully for the unity of the Church. Enemies plotted his death, and he was martyred in 1623.

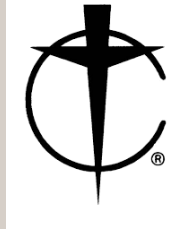
