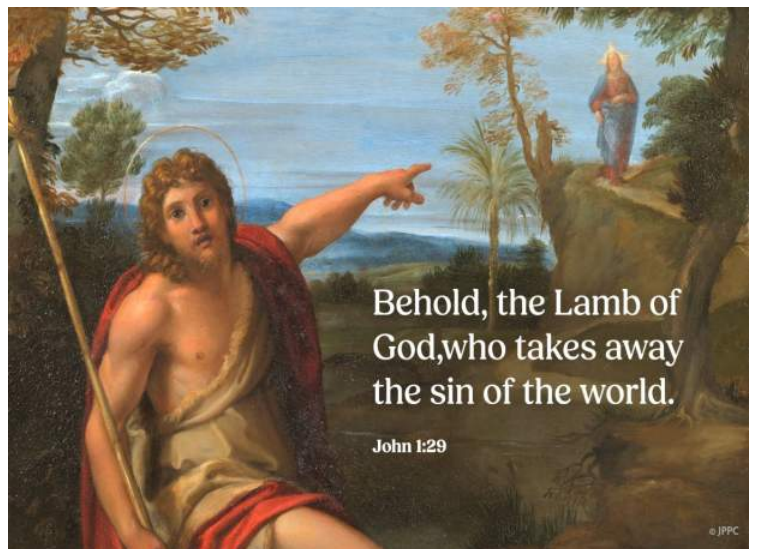

What is an active parishioner?

An active parishioner is a person who participates in the life of the Church. This means to follow the teachings of Jesus Christ and share in Christ’s role as priest, prophet and King. We are called to lead others to faith by our good example, through loving service to others, and offering our prayers, works and activities to God.

- An active parishioner is a person who has received or is preparing to receive the sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation.
- An active parishioner is a person who attends Mass regularly at St. William the Abbot and actively supports the sacramental programs for Penance, Eucharist and Confirmation. Parents who want a Catholic Faith Formation & Education for their children will see to it that their family attends Mass faithfully EVERY Sunday.
- An active parishioner gives of themselves by donating TIME, TALENT and TREASURE to the ministries of the parish and or to the volunteer organizations that support the parish. We are to share in the responsibilities that keep our Parish alive in a vibrant way.
- An active parishioner is a good financial steward of the church. As a parishioner, it is important to understand that giving financially to support the parish is a vital and key component to active parishioner status.

Why you need to be an active parishioner?

Parishioners seeking to be godparents or sponsors for the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation, or those wishing to be joined in Holy Matrimony must first be verified as “active members” of the parish.

An active member:

- 1) Is properly registered with the parish
- 2) Faithfully attends Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation
- 3) Participates in parish activities/ministries whenever possible.
- 4) Consistently uses the parish envelope system or the electronic giving program to support the parish.

"Saint Fabian was a Roman layman who came into the city from his farm one day as clergy and people were preparing to elect a new pope. Eusebius, a Church historian, says a dove flew in and settled on the head of Fabian. This sign united the votes of clergy and laity, and he was chosen unanimously.

He led the Church for 14 years and died a martyr's death during the persecution of Decius in 250 A.D. Saint Cyprian wrote to his successor that Fabian was an "incomparable" man whose glory in death matched the holiness and purity of his life.

In the catacombs of Saint Callistus, the stone that covered Fabian's grave may still be seen, broken into four pieces, bearing the Greek words, "Fabian, bishop, martyr." **Saint Fabian shares the celebration of his liturgical feast with Saint Sebastian on January 20."**

"St Marianne Cope, OSF (also known as **Marianne of Moloka'i**; January 23, 1838 – August 9, 1918) was a German-born American **Religious Sister** who was a member of the **Sisters of St. Francis of Syracuse, New York**, and founding director of its St. Joseph's Hospital in the city, among the first of 50 general hospitals in the country.^[1] In 1883 she led a group of six other **Sisters** to the **Kingdom of Hawaii** to care for persons suffering **leprosy** on the island of **Moloka'i** and aid in developing the medical infrastructure in Hawai'i. **Despite direct contact with the patients over many years, Cope did not contract the disease, nor did any of the other Sisters assisting her.**" Amen! Canonized: 10/21/2012 by Pope Benedict Feast day: January 23rd Patron Saint of: Hawaii, lepers, outcasts, those with HIV/AIDS



Sponsorship for the Sacrament of Baptism and Confirmation

Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate include:

- ~ A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, and Confirmation and, if married, must be married in the Catholic Church.
- ~ A sponsor must be at least 16 years old.
- ~ A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church. In other words, he/she must be an Active member of the parish.
- ~ If he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. William the Abbot years ago but now lives elsewhere, he/she is not an active member of this parish. Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in whose territory he/she resides. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.

Why is it so important to register with a parish?

- ~Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Some people think that because they attend a particular parish they automatically belong.
- ~Registering as parishioners requires signing up, formally enrolling yourself in a parish.
- ~Registration is a commitment to a community, a way to be included in the religious, social and ministerial activities of your parish.
- ~Registration shows you belong. It is also necessary for certain benefits, like scheduling sacraments, obtaining a sponsor certificate, and getting donation statements for your taxes. Most importantly, it lets the parish count on you, to call on you to assist in its mission.
- ~Registering in your parish is a statement of faith and confidence in the life and work of your parish.

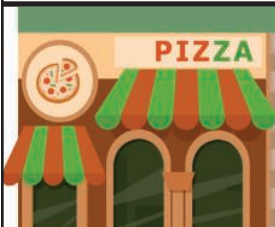

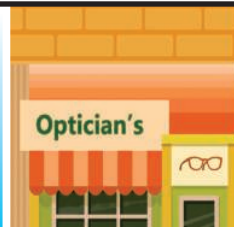

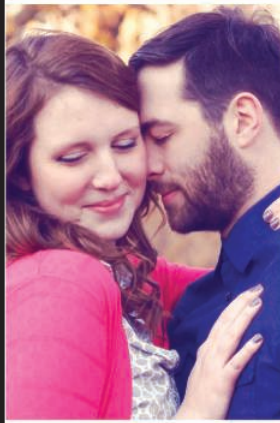
